Recently, I found the following posted on my good pastor-friend Rev. Mark Surburg's blog:

#### Attendance at the Divine Service – Supporting the Body of Christ

Why do we come to the Divine Service on Sunday? Normally we answer this question by referring to God's gifts of the Means of Grace through which He delivers forgiveness to us and strengthens us in the faith. We stress our need for these gifts because of own sinful and fallen condition.

This is certainly true, and must be said first. However, it is not the only valid perspective from which we need to consider this issue. Instead of always focusing on what *we* receive, we need to also consider how our presence at the Divine Service serves *others*.

An early church writer in Syria addressed this very topic during the third century A.D. In the thirteenth chapter of his writing, the *Didascalia* (which means "teaching") he urges:

"When you are teaching, command and exhort the people to be faithful to the assembly of the church. Let them not fail to attend, but let them gather faithfully together. Let no one deprive the church by staying away; if they do, they deprive the body of Christ of one of its members! For you must not think only of others but of yourself as well, when you hear the words that our Lord spoke: 'Who does not gather with me, scatters' (Mt. 12:30). Since you are members of Christ, you must not scatter yourselves outside the church by failing to assemble there. For we have Christ for our head, as He himself promised and announced, so that 'you have become sharers with us'(2 Peter 1:14). Do not then, make light of your own selves, do not deprive our Savior of His members, do not rend, do not scatter His body!"

Paul told the Corinthians, "Now you are the body of Christ, and individual members of it" (1 Corinthians 12:27). We became part of the body of Christ in Holy Baptism (1 Corinthians 12:13). The most concrete manifestation of the body of Christ occurs in the Divine Service as we receive the body and blood of Christ in the Lord's Supper and are so joined into one body – the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 10:16-17).


As the writer of the *Didascalia* points out, our absence from the Divine Service deprives the body of Christ gathered in church of one of its members. Our absence takes away from the mutual encouragement that take place as we gather *together* to receive Christ's gifts.

Our presence at the Divine Service serves our own spiritual need for forgiveness and strengthening in the faith. However, our presence *also* serves the other members of our church who together with us are the Body of Christ. May our Lord help each of us to ponder and appreciate this important aspect of our life *together* in Christ.

Good points, Pastor Mark...good points.

#### Ladies Aid/LWML Meeting July 17, 2014

She continued then to read about the June LWML convention theme "Sow the Word." Ours is no ordinary seed to sow. The seed gathering is power packed. So how are we doing scattering the seed?

Vice President Marty Williams lead the Mite Devotion. It was given for the Native-American Outreach Training Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. The need is \$95,000. A 2-page Grant Story for the Native American Outreach and a prayer guide for mission grants was given to members.

For eight mission grants for the LWML District 2014-2016 Biennium-came to \$92,455.65. Also as voted at the April 26th 3-Zone LWML Rally-Ft. Wayne will have the LWML Convention in 2021.

Cancer Pad Sewing: 60 were taken to the N.E. Cancer Services, 80 were brought back and 100 were ordered for September.

opening prayer. In Genesis chapters 37, 39 and 40 is the account of Jacob's son Joseph and how things were "out of control" for him. At age 17

and his father's favorite son in his old age, things became "out of control" when he visited his brothers in their grazing fields. The brothers were very jealous of Joseph and his coat of many colors given to him by his father and they became angry with Joseph because he told



them of his dreams that he would one day rule over them. They put Joseph in a cistern and then ended up selling Joseph to merchants traveling nearby for 20 shekels. They took his "coat' back to Jacob with blood from a goat indicating he had been killed.

Joseph in Egypt: He was sold to the Captain of the Guards, an officer of Pharaoh. Joseph found favor with his new master Potiphar (the Lord was with Joseph, so he prospered) and eventually he

was given charge of Potiphar's household and all he owned. An "out of control" time came when Potiphar's wife




lusted for him and Joseph refused her and left fast, but also left his cloak near her. She told her father that Joseph had made sport of her. Potiphar put Joseph in prison.

Joseph in Prison: (There the Lord showed Joseph kindness) Joseph became a favorite of the prison warden who made him to be in charge of those held in that prison. Joseph had an opportunity to help two prisoners, a cup bearer and a baker who had dreams they could not understand. His interpretation meant the cup bearer would return to his job and the baker would die. This did happen to them.



After 2 years: Pharaoh had two dreams. The cup bearer remembered Joseph had interpreted his dream, so he told Pharaoh and



to him. (God made all known to Joseph to interpret Pharaoh's dreams). Egypt would have 7 years of plenty and 7 years of famine. Joseph told Pharaoh how all could be handled for these times. Even Pharaoh said Joseph was one in whom is the spirit of God. All came about for the years of plenty and the famine in Egypt and other areas even into Canaan.

Joseph sees his brothers again: They came at the request of their father to get food and supplies for their families. They came before Joseph and he



asked them many questions about their family and sent them back with all they needed plus the silver they had paid for the supplies that they found in a sack. They returned to Joseph again to give back the silver in case they would be caught with it.

Joseph brought them to his house and gave them a dinner and asked that they bring back their youngest brother Benjamin. At first they refused, but then they did bring Benjamin even though their father did not want him to go.

Joseph Reveals who he is: He told his brothers that God had planned all that happened to him to save lives using him even within the "out of control' times. Joseph praised God and reconciled with his brothers. Then he had the joy of having his father brought to him and he gave them all a place in Goshen to live nearby.



(Joseph's story "out of control" continued)

Genesis 4, Matthew 15 and James 1: Tells how sin specifically can influence the "out of control" events in life.

<u>Romans 3, Ephesians2 and 1 John:</u> Tell us who experiences the effects of sin—everyone.

<u>Faith Talk:</u> The tools of the Holy Spirit to sustain our faith until life's end are psalms, hymns and praise as seen in Colossians 3:16. In 1 Peter 3:21 we know that our Baptism saves us by the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Mark 14:22-25 tells us we are sustained by the holy Spirit through the Lord's Holy communion instituted by Jesus as his living sacrifice through his body and blood for our salvation.

The program was closed with the Lord's Prayer and the table prayer.

At Fellowship time Apple Dumplings and Ice Cram were served by Joan Lane and Kathaleen Reese with members seated at a table decorated with seashells. Marty Williams won the table prize.



This ministry has been able to help meet the physical, educational and spiritual needs of over 3,400 children in 12 schools throughout rural Liberia this past decade. Over 60% of rural Liberian children are not in school and more boys than girls were receiving an education until this ministry was founded in 2004.

VBS children collected \$120.22 for Lutheran World Flood Relief "clean-up" buckets. Each bucket contains items to clean flooded homes, etc, and costs \$50 per bucket, plus a mop & broom. Thank you to all who contributed!
