Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

I wanted to stop for a few minutes to talk with you and let you know that all is well in the Schneider household, as we approach the end of 2013. (Already?!? Where has this year gone?)

I have been busy, keeping the kidz squared away, running my household, and getting ready to apply for readmission to the Seminary. In preparation for that return, I have been communicating with the Seminary and my advisors, and one of the ways that I am preparing is by taking on another formal fieldwork assignment.

I am now serving as a fieldworker with Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, one of the "urban" parishes here in Fort Wayne. Serving with and under Pr. Russ Dewell, I am honing my homiletical skills, and assisting with other duties in the parish as he sees fit. It is a fun time, and rewarding, although a little interesting at times too. Pr. Dewell is actually a little younger than I am, and is a chaplain as well, in the Army Reserve.

Joshua is doing well, completing his fall coursework, and looking forward to a break

in the classroom routine. In addition to attending IPFW full-time, he is teaching percussion at both Norwell High School and Carroll High school, in their marching programs. He has also been serving as a life guard at the "Y", and most recently, has been returned for his final marching season with North Coast Academy in Saginaw, where he is the section leader for the tenors.

Sarah, well, she is still Sarah. She returned to Red Wing and Southeast Tech this year to continue her education in instrument repair. After she completed the Band Instrument Repair program, she decided to broaden her horizons by learning Guitar Repair and Manufacture. By May of next year, she will have built both an electric bass guitar, as well as an acoustic guitar. She is already planning to return for a second year in this program next year. She is also still working at the "Y" in Red Wing.

I am still working with Bethesda Lutheran Communities as well, and should be at least until I have been reaccepted into the Seminary. It remains a fun and dynamic job, with few dull spots as we serve people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, as well as the churches and parishes where they attend.

On to the next task, I need to run for now.

We wish each of you a very blessed holiday season, through this time of Advent as we approach the manger, in which we will see that God has come to us, and indeed, remains with us every day!

#### **Helping Our Neighbors**

This past year, the Whitley County Ministerial Association assumed direction of the **Whitley County Energy Assistance Fund**, believing that the Fund was meeting a great need in our community.

We are coming to the end of 2013. For some it has been a very good year, and for others, they have made it through. For others yet, they may be quite concerned as to whether they are able to provide for some basic human needs. Some of your churches provide or supply for food pantries in our community--that is great! But others may have a need to supply their home with essential heat and light.

Many families have been helped, yet there are always more. A family may receive one \$150 grant per year--and this is paid directly to the utility involved, not to the individual or family receiving aid. At our November meeting, the Ministerial Association agreed that for the time being, the Energy Assistance Fund would limit our help to \$100 per situation per year. While this cuts back on the amount of help we can give, it broadens it out a bit.

Now, many of you know that \$150, let alone \$100, doesn't go very far in helping folks. You can see what your own family spends for heat and light in a month. We are trying to arrange some fundraisers to help supply the funds for Energy Assistance.

There are approximately 70 churches in our community.

If each church could help out in some way to supply some of the funds necessary to help our neighbors in need, it would be a BIG help to the Energy Assistance Fund. Or if there are individuals that would like to help out in anyway possible (any amount helps).

So, will you help your neighbors?

You can give your donation to Pastor Phil and he will make sure it gets to the Energy Assistance Fund.


