As I prepare this month's article, there's so much happening in the world – we've got to take a look at some of that. Specifically in one instance, the recent Supreme Court ruling regarding the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and religious liberty. I share with you below a letter received from our Synod's president, Rev. Matthew Harrison:

The Wait Is Over on June 30, 2014 in OFFICE OF THE PRESDENT, PRESSROOM 4

Supreme Court Ruling Emboldens Us to Continue to Carry On

"Two years ago, I sat on a panel before Congress, testifying to the importance of religious liberty in America today.

It seems like a long time ago.

Since then, we have seen and heard a steady stream of news, from the church and the culture, about the Health and Human Services' mandate and the Affordable Care Act, abortifacients and the conscience, religious freedoms and what this means for women.

Thankfully, the wait is over. The Supreme Court has ruled, and the verdict is in: In a land-mark case, the Supreme Court ruled in favor of religious liberty, specifically in regard to closely held corporations (those with a small number of shareholders and offering no public stock, such as corporations that are family-owned, not operated by boards).

While we rejoice in this strong upholding of religious freedom, this decision does not

signal an end to this discussion. It simply emboldens us carry on, doing what we do best as Christians: praying, confessing the faith and living it out in our daily callings.

We pray that Americans, whose consciences are burdened because they have been forced to violate their religious beliefs, would know God's comfort and forgiveness.

We confess that life, which begins at conception, is a gift from God and ought to be held in the highest regard in this country.

We live, knowing that the First Amendment guarantees us not only the right to worship, but also to practice our faith as Lutheran citizens of this great nation, serving our neighbor where the Lord has placed us.

We do all of this, even as we rejoice with the Greens of Hobby Lobby, with the Hahns of Conestoga Wood Specialties and with our millions of brothers and sisters in the United States who believe just as strongly in the religious liberties guaranteed in our Constitution.

Today we are thankful for this step toward maintaining the integrity of our religious freedoms inherent in the First Amendment, but we will also remain ever mindful. The issue is and will continue to be purely and simply about religious freedom.

And so we pray. We confess. We live.

"We fought for a free conscience in this country," I told the committee two years ago, "and we won't give it up without a fight."

I meant that, and I pray you do too."

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING June 17, 2014 Minutes

Present were: President Jeff Braun; Judy Gilbert; Treasurer Jill Coons; Phil Coons; Head Trustee Dan Knuth; Elder Steve Smith; and Pastor Phil Rittner.

Pastor Phil opened the meeting with a reading from Acts 2 and prayer.

President Jeff Braun made the motion to accept the minutes from the last meeting posted in the Zealant; seconded by Steve Smith. Unanimously approved by voice vote.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Karen Scheumann being absent, Jill Coons delivered the full Treasurer's report for the month of May. (Please see posted Profit & Loss and Cash Balances sheets.)

• Jill remarked of note that the "Furnace Fund" has accumulated \$2,168.00 toward the repairs of the gym-area heating and a/c units.

Dan Knuth brought up the status of the loan with Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) currently in progress. Dan remarked that we've received additional forms to be completed and he also circulated a letter for signature from the Church Council approving Zion applying for

- a loan from LCEF. Jill will fax completed/ signed forms to LCEF.
- Dan Knuth also questioned as to the availability of funds from the Altar Guild for the remodeling of the Sacristy. Jill Coons wasn't entirely sure; further investigations are required.
- Dan Knuth made the motion to accept the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Steve Smith. Unanimously approved by voice vote.

<u>Elder's Report</u>: Steve Smith presented the report of the Elder's last meeting.

- Letters will be posted in the Zealant received from the seminary on sharing a Deaconess with other area LCMS Churches; and a letter from Miller's Merry Manor on a volunteer program called"Hearts and Hands" that they are undertaking.
- Revitalization week-end will be held on September 19, 20, and 21, 2014.
- A new Pastor/Elder visitation program has been set up for the rest of the year.
- Discussed a new LCMS Foundation grant possibility that is available to LCMS congregations.
- Discussed the following positions that still need filled within our congregation:

*a delegate to Lutheran Social Services *a delegate to the Indiana District Convention 2015

*a delegate to the Lutheran Foundation *and, a new Secretary for Church Council/ Voter's Assembly

[Pastor Phil remarked that should anyone know of someone interested or seemingly qualified to serve in these positions – to let Pastor know and he will contact them.] -Average attendance for May: Sundays: 50; Midweek: 15

<u>Trustee's Report</u>: given by Dan Knuth, Head-Trustee.

- Signatures are required this evening from Church Council for LCEF loan forms.
- Sacristy remodel: a quote has been received from a local worker for \$300/day (\$600 total) for the work necessary in the Sacristy. Additional quotes will be obtained.
- Update given by Phil Coons regarding the new Pole Barn project.

*We've been told by County Inspector we

will need state approval before a local permit can be issued. Phil C. has a lead on a local architect who could possibly assist in us getting state approval.

*The final quote from the contractor chosen to perform the work is approximately \$14,000 (this is more than presently received/raised for the project.)

*Pastor will check with neighbor church regarding how they obtained permits/approvals for their new building.

 Dan commented on the status of the Lehmburg Endowment Fund. The monies are still held by LCEF in a money market interest bearing account until investing decisions can be made.

<u>Board of Education Report</u>: Given for the Board by Judy Gilbert.

- Met last on June 8, 2014. Present were Barb & Kenny Knuth; Barb Lahrman; Judy Gilbert; Joyce Reidt; and Pastor Phil. There was no Library report.
- Barb L. read "When the Wind Blows" as opening devotion, from Joel 2:28-32.
- Previous minutes were approved as submitted.
- Sunday School Report for May 2014Attendance: Students: 5; Adults: 13. Mission receipts gathered during April and May for Pastor Jeff Horn in Papua New Guinea was \$175. Mission project for June and July will be New Life Lutheran Church, Liberian Children's Ministry.
- Pastor's Report: Confirmation Camp dates are set for July 14-18 & August 4-8, 2014. Six children presently qualify for Camp. Jerry Lahrman is stepping down from teaching the high school Sunday School class; Katie Rittner has volunteered to take this position.
- Old Business: More people are needed for VBS. Added to last month's list of volunteers are Madison Cook, Regan Decker, Adrian Kimmel, Bonnie Pease, Katheleen Reese, Sami Blomquist, and Penny Braun.
- New Business: We still need a teacher for the older class. We have \$1000 from a grant that we can use for VBS. VBS dedication/installation and set-up will be Sunday, July 6, 2014. The Board of Ed budget was discussed and we have decided not to make any changes. We tabled until July Sunday School recognition, Rally Day, and other

- calendar events. Our mission project for VBS will be LCMS Flood Bucket program. Promotion Sunday will be August 13, 2014.
- Next meeting was set for July 13, 2014 with a VBS meeting to be set in the next few weeks.
- With no other business, Barb Lahrman adjourned the meeting and Pastor gave the Benediction.

It can in fact be noted here that the Church Council approves this addition of Phil and Jill Coons to the signature cards of these accounts.
- The youth desire a weekly insert in the bulletin to keep them and the congregation abreast of

happenings with the youth group.

And, Pastor Phil is working on a new children's ministry project with our youth. It would entail the acquiring of a grant from the LCMS Foundation in St. Louis, MO.

- Judy Gilbert suggested that youth and the Catechism Camp participants help carry garage sale items from the basement to the gym the week before the sale.


Youth Group (grades 6-12)




