Pastor's Corner

We give Thee but Thine own, Whate'er the gift may be; All that we have is Thine alone, A trust, O Lord, from Thee.

May we Thy bounties thus As stewards true receive And gladly, as Thou blessest us, To Thee our first-fruits give! (LSB 781:1–2).

We sing these stanzas every communion Sunday when the offerings of God's faithful people are received at His Altar. It's a sung reminder of who God is and who we are in relation to Him, of what God does for us and gives to us, and how we respond to His generosity.

We are stewards of God's varied grace to us. As stewards we acknowledge that God owns all things and that everything in heaven and on earth belongs to Him (1 Chron 29:14; Ps 24:1; Ps 100:3; 1 Cor 4:7; 1 Cor 6:19). Even we ourselves—all that we are and all that we have—are His. We are His because He created us, preserves us, redeemed us, and sanctifies us. As the stewards of what He has done for us and given to us, we give of our first fruits to Him and His Church

And the Lord receives them and presses them into a use all His own. He sanctifies it. He hallows it. He uses it to ensure that the Word of God is still preached among us. He uses it to ensure that there is water for Baptism, bread and wine for His Holy Supper. He uses what He gives to you and what you give back to Him for your good. Everything that happens in the church is purchased with the giving of the saints

from what God has provided them. Holy giving from holy people pressed into holy service.

But there's more. For our giving does not just make the liturgical life of the church possible. It's not just the necessary means by which the vessels and sacramental elements, the hymn books and pastors are made available. The giving of God's stewards is part of the liturgy itself, part of the Divine Service. It is one of our responses within the liturgy where we, not just with words spoken or sung, but with deeds declare, live out and live in, the excellencies of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Pet 2:9). Our offerings are part of God's sanctifying work that He has us do in the Divine Service for the life of the world.

There's still more! Our offerings help the Word of God be spread unto all nations: by our giving of our pledge and support to the Indiana District LC-MS; by our Joyful Response to whatever need may be here at Zion; and to our chosen mission projects throughout the year – that they may prosper and too glorify God before all people, that the sweet grace of God would be heard by all people everywhere, that salvation would come to everyone! Now that's taking what "we give Thee but Thine own..." a long ways!

That's what makes our stewardship so precious and significant. God hallows what we give and employs it to sanctify us and others. And that is why we sing: "And gladly, as Thou blessest us, To Thee our first-fruits give!"

Trustee Report:



With our congregation getting older and more and more people being diagnosed with A-Fib, the board of outreach feels it will be a good idea for Zion to have one of these on the grounds. With a few being trained by the Red Cross it will help our congregation in time of crisis if needed.

In the narthex you will see a big thermometer to help us show us how we are doing towards reaching our goal. On that thermometer there are small envelopes to put your donation along with your name so you can get credit for the amount given.

- A. Automated external defibrillator
- Q. What is an AED?
- A. An AED is a sophisticated, reliable, safe, computerized devise that delivers electric shocks to a c casualty in cardiac arrest when the ECG rhythm is one that is likely to respond to a shock.
 - Q. Are AED's easy to use.
- A. It is very easy to use an AED. You turn on the device and there are clear and concise prompts' advising you exactly what to do every step of the way.
 - Q. How much does it cost?
- A. Depending on the type we buy it will be between \$1500 and \$2000. If there are any questions, please talk to Monica Koldyke or Peg Brooke.


