LWML 3-Zone Rally

April 26, 2014

The Rally was held at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne. 119 LWML Ladies attended and 5 guests. Pastor Jeff Geisler gave the opening Devotion. A buffet breakfast was enjoyed by all. Beautiful banners from the 3-Zones were brought to the Rally.

Speaker Mary Momy gave a stirring account of how she came to start Ministering to Muslims more than 6 years ago.

Mary grew up in Eastern Sudan. Her father worked for the government and her mother was a teacher. She has two brothers and one sister. They spoke only Arabic. While in college she wanted to learn English and she found a man who would tutor her. During her lessons she found out he was a Christian and he read to her from the Bible. He told her about Jesus and the New Testament's salvation. What caught her attention especially was that he said God promised him he would go to heaven because he believed that Jesus was his Savior. She started to read the Bible herself by taking it home with her and hiding it from her family. Reading the Christian Bible was against the Islam faith for they believed only in Allah as taught from their book, the Koran. She kept on with her English tutor and planned on searching more in the Bible. She did this when her family was away at their prayers at the Mosque. In Galatians 3:4-5 her tutor told her that it is by God's grace that he would send the Holy Spirit for her faith in Jesus. She felt so connected and that God was speaking to her. But, the family finally found out that she was reading the Bible and that she was wanting to be a Christian. They took everything away from her and they beat her for two days. Her grandmother asked that they allow her to think it all over and come back to the Islam faith. But, she refused and finally ran away to be in exile from her native Sudan. She was helped by generous people along the way while the police were looking for her. If caught she would have been killed.

From helpful Christian people she was given a new ID. She spent time in the South of

the country and then 9 months in Kenya. Eventually Christians helped her to come to the United States/. In 2007 she arrived in Charleston, NC. She settled in Fort Wayne after meeting her husband, who worked for Project Mercy, a local organization by Ethiopian refugees. Sadly, for her and their two children, her husband passes away. She continued on to support herself by telling her story to groups and to teach other U.S. Muslims the true way to heaven.

She is now at Taylor University in Upland, IN where she is working with Muslim women from Yemen-actually 38 families. She helps in summer camps in Topeka, IN with English classes taught along with American Christian values and there are scholarships for this. Mary often attends St. Augustine Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne, and the largely African congregation, along with other local churches, has helped her reach out into the local and growing Muslim community. Mary asked the ladies of the Rally to please pray for the Muslim people that they see their faith in a different way for their salvation through Jesus. Questions asked were about her family in Eastern Sudan; Her family has been ostracized and her sister is not allowed to marry because of what she did. She has actually talked to her family, but they do not know where she is. The Muslims do know about Jesus, but, only as a prophet and not as the son of God. She had been warned about a group called CARE that tries to find and stop Muslim Christians in the U.S. She has had threatening e-mails so it is still dangerous for her.

The meeting followed with a request for a vote that LWML Fort Wayne and other close cities to possibly host the 2020 Biennial LWML Convention. The vote was positive. A skit was given to encourage members to attend the 2014 Convention being held in West Lafayette for the two days of June 20-22. Its theme is "Sow What" which is taken from Mark 4:3. Quilts can be brought along for Lutheran World Relief. LWML North Zone Fall Rally will be at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne either October 11th or 18th.

The Ingathering for Muslim Ministry came to \$1078.50.

Members were asked to pray for 18 LWML Grants separately totaling \$1,830,000 and \$1,345,712. Those targeted for Indiana were for Concordia Seminary, Worship for Shut-ins, and the I.U. Campus Ministry.

Zone announcements were made and a conclusion was given by District President Margie Wickert. During the closing devotions Pastor Geisler had the members talk in groups to tell each other who was the one person who most influenced them in their faith. Hymns "Jesus Christ Is Risen Today" and "Serve the Lord with Gladness" were sung.

The meeting closed with the LWML Pledge.

Was presented by Lois Duffy and was entitled "Food In The Bible." Afterward, Jesus invited them to a breakfast of bread and fish on the shore.

Members prayed the meal prayer "Come Lord Jesus Be Our Guest and Let These Thy Gifts to Us Be Blessed" then a thank you was added with "Oh, Give Thanks Unto the Lord for He is Good and His mercies endure forever."

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

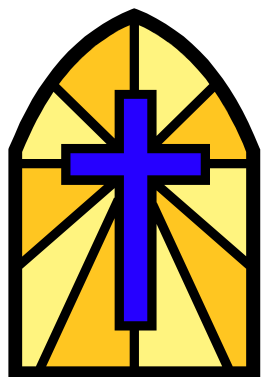
