Gloria Nimtz lead the Bible Study entitled "Forgiven Creatures" taken from the Fall 2014 LWML Quarterly. The Opening Discussion: It held true to how we like Job must look to our Creator for our own trails and trust that He will bless us. Passages from the Bible were read by members. It tells us what our Creator says: In Romans 5:8—we find that while we were still sinners. Christ died for us. In John 3:14-17-Jesus told Nichodemus that God gave his only begotten Son to save the world and those that believe in Him will be saved. We see in Genesis 1:27 that God created man in His own image and therefore we live with our Creator in mind-literally in our minds through His Holy Spirit. We can be renewed even though our bodies may be sick and aging. In 2 Corinthians 4:6-7 God said "Let light shine out of the darkness and make His light shine in our hearts. This

knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ comes from the power of God and not from us. Knowing this we are humbled to want to praise God, our Creator.

Wayne' Since 2004, the Liberian Children's Ministry has focused on meeting the physical, educational and spiritual needs of the children in Liberia. Schools are being built in Rural Liberia with our partner churches. In 2013-2014, 3400 children were enrolled in 12 schools. It costs \$3,000—\$5,000 to run a school each year. The goal is to provide a Christ centered education.

The voluntary monetary ingathering will be used to support this ministry. A gift of \$25 will support one child's schooling for one year! 


