This is the day the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

Easter is fast approaching! As we have been studying during our Bible classes and in our Scripture Readings during worship these past several weeks, the season of Lent is one of gaining penitence. Penitence is being sorry for one's sins. So as we have journeyed through this Lenten season, we've considered those 7 Psalms considered 'Penitential': those Psalms whereas we identify with the writer of the psalm a guilt and remorse for how we have disobeyed God and His Commandments.

It is good for us to be brought down by such... penitence. For, how can we then appreciate the sweet grace God – that His only Son, Jesus Christ, died so that you and I could live forever. But what about further study? "What does this mean" is important for many folks; but how should one dig deeper into the depths of theology to grasp yet even greater understanding?

Martin Luther spoke often about the wisdom of Theology, especially in his famous axiom: **Prayer, Meditation, and Affliction** (also known in Latin as *Oratio, meditation, tentatio.*) I offer the following excerpt from Luther's own hand:

"Moreover, I want to point out to you a correct way of studying theology, for I have had practice in that. If you keep to it, you will become so learned that you yourself could (if it were necessary) write books just as good as those of the fathers and councils, even as I (in God) dare to presume and boast, without arrogance and lying, that in the matter of writing books I do not stand much behind some of the fathers. Of my life I can by no means make the same boast. This is the way taught by holy King David (and doubtlessly used also by all the patriarchs and prophets) in the one hundred nineteenth Psalm. There you will find three rules, amply presented throughout the whole Psalm. They are *Oratio, Meditatio, Tentatio.*

Firstly, **you should know that the Holy Scriptures constitute a book which turns the wisdom of all other books into foolishness, because not one teaches about eternal life except this one alone. Therefore you should straightway despair of your reason and understanding.** With them you will not attain eternal life, but, on the contrary, your presumptuousness will plunge you and others with you out of heaven (as happened to Lucifer) into the abyss of hell. But kneel down in your little room [Matt. 6:6] and pray to God with real humility and earnestness, that he through his dear Son may give you his Holy Spirit, who will enlighten you, lead you, and give you understanding.

Thus you see how David keeps praying in the above-mentioned Psalm, "Teach me, Lord, instruct me, lead me, show me," and many more words like these. Although he well knew and daily heard and read the text of Moses and other books besides, still he wants to lay hold of the real teacher of the Scriptures himself, so that he may not

seize upon them pell-mell with his reason and become his own teacher. For such practice gives rise to factious spirits who allow themselves to nurture the delusion that the Scriptures are subject to them and can be easily grasped with their reason, as if they were *Markolf*⁹ or Aesop's Fables, for which no Holy Spirit and no prayers are needed.

Secondly, you should meditate, that is, not only in your heart, but also externally, by actually repeating and comparing oral speech and literal words of the book, reading and rereading them with diligent attention and reflection, so that you may see what the Holy Spirit means by them. And take care that you do not grow weary or think that you have done enough when you have read, heard, and spoken them once or twice, and that you then have complete understanding. You will never be a particularly good theologian if you do that, for you will be like untimely fruit which falls to the ground before it is haft ripe.

Thus you see in this same Psalm how David constantly boasts that he will talk, meditate, speak, sing, hear, read, by day and night and always, about nothing except God's Word and commandments. For God will not give you his Spirit without the external Word; so take your cue from that. His command to write, preach, read, hear, sing, speak, etc., outwardly¹² was not given in vain.

Thirdly, there is *tentatio, Anfechtung*. This is the touchstone which teaches you not only to know and understand, but also to experience how right, how true, how sweet, how lovely, how mighty, how comforting God's Word is, wisdom beyond all wisdom.

Thus you see how David, in the Psalm mentioned, complains so often about all kinds of enemies, arrogant princes or tyrants, false spirits and factions, whom he must tolerate because he meditates, that is, because he is occupied with God's Word (as has been said) in all manner of ways. For as soon as God's Word takes root and grows in you, the devil will harry you, and will make a real doctor of you, and by his assaults will teach you to seek and love God's Word. I myself (if you will permit me, mere mouse-dirt, to be mingled with pepper) am deeply indebted to my papists that through the devil's raging they have beaten, oppressed, and distressed me so much. That is to say, they have made a fairly good theologian of me, which I would not have become otherwise. And I heartily grant them what they have won in return for making this of me, honor, victory, and triumph, for that's the way they wanted it.

There now, with that you have David's rules. If you study hard in accord with his example, then you will also sing and boast with him in the Psalm, "The law of thy mouth is better to me than thousands of gold and silver pieces" [Ps. 119:72]. Also, "Thy commandment makes me wiser than my enemies, for it is ever with me. I have more understanding than all my teachers, for thy testimonies are my meditation. I understand more than the aged, for I keep thy precepts," etc. [Ps. 119:98–100]. And it will be your experience that the books of the fathers will taste stale and putrid to you in comparison. You will not only despise the books written by adversaries, but the longer you write and teach the less you will be pleased with yourself. When you have reached this point, then do not be afraid to hope that you have begun to become a real theologian, who can teach not only the young and imperfect Christians, but also the maturing and perfect ones. For indeed, Christ's church has all kinds of Christians in it who are young, old, weak, sick, healthy, strong, energetic, lazy, simple, wise, etc.

If, however, you feel and are inclined to think you have made it, flattering yourself with your own little books, teaching, or writing, because you have done it beautifully and preached excellently; if you are highly pleased when someone praises you in the presence of others; if you perhaps look for praise, and would sulk or quit what you are doing if you did not get it—if you are of that stripe, dear friend, then take yourself by the ears, and if you do this in the right way you will find a beautiful pair of big, long, shaggy donkey ears. Then do not spare any expense! Decorate them with golden bells, so that people will be able to hear you wherever you go, point their fingers at you, and say, "See, See! There goes that clever beast, who can write such exquisite books and preach so remarkably well." That very moment you will be blessed and blessed beyond measure in the kingdom of heaven. Yes, in that heaven where hellfire is ready for the devil and his angels. To sum up: Let us be proud and seek honor in the places where we can. But in this book the honor is God's alone, as it is said, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble" [I Pet. 5:5]; to whom be glory, world without end, Amen."¹

I share with each of you the joy of anticipating our celebration of Easter soon! I look forward to seeing you all in church!



Since the Ladies Aid is no longer an organized group of Zion Lutheran Church, it was voted upon by the members to give the monies accumulated over the years to the following groups at Zion.

The Savings Account, in the amount of \$1656.20 has been given to the Altar Guild. ALL the monies in this account were memorials given to the Ladies Aid over the years. We have used it only to purchase items needed by the Altar Guild such as the Brass Advent Candle stand, the Processional Cross, special candles and other items as memorials. The pastor's cassock was purchased from this account also.

A CD with LCEF in the amount of \$3500.00 was cashed in and has been given to the fund for the Automatic Doors. This money was made by the Ladies Aid serving dinners years ago to local organizations such as Whitley Co. Extension for 20 years, AARP for 8 ears, plus the Kiwanis, BPW, ASCS, teachers group, wedding receptions and serving food at some of the county festivals. The monies were put in CE's with LCEF for the purpose of having monies available to build churches and schools. They have accumulated interest over the years.

Another CD in the amount of \$1950.53 with LCEF (also with money made by serving dinners) was cashed in August 2014 and \$2000.00 was donated to the Furnace/Air Condition Fund.

The Ladies Aid of Zion has minutes dating back to 1928 (see copy on bulletin board), but was mentioned long before that in Zion's Voter minutes, so they have a history of over 100 years. They served every purpose in the church on Ellsworth St., doing all the cleaning of church and building for Sunday School with a kitchen, taking care of Altar Guild duties, cooking dinners, served on the lawn between the church and other building. They sold nuts, with "Stamny", Mrs. Stamm, former minister's wife, known as the "nut" lady taking her cart with nuts all over Columbia City. They had numerous bake and other money making projects all in supporting the needs of the church. When the new church at the present location was built, the Ladies Aid again sewed curtains, painted, made monies to purchase items for the new church, and whatever they could do.

So, the Ladies Aid has been a vital part of Zion Lutheran Church, and despite all 5 members being in their 80's and some with health problems, they will continue to do what they can with their sewing of cancer pads, sending cards and gifts to Zion's sick and shut-ins, collecting and trimming stamps, collecting cards for passages, and help the new LWML when they can.


