The Resurrection of Our Lord

Easter Sunday

March 27, 2016

Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." (John 20:28-29)

Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia! Today is the day we hear the Word of Christ about His victory over death. When He said "It is Finished."

He meant it. His Word and Work is trustworthy and certain.

That said, we don't see it. Christ defeated death, but it still darkens our

lives, creating sorrow and much anxiety. Christ forgives sin, but we continue to struggle. Christ gives holiness, but we just don't manage to see it in our lives.

This is an exercise in your spirituality, similar to the struggle of Thomas. Do you go by what you see, or by what you have heard? Christ has spoken about you. You have been baptized into His death and resurrection. You are in Him. You are holy and set apart, a treasured possession of the One who conquered death.

As that treasured possession you live out the life God has given you. The devil sees your reality better than you do, that is why he attacks and accuses. Often times folks will see it too, even though you may not. Even at the Last Day Christians will not fully understand just how much good God had done through them. From what we receive, we live, bearing Christ in the world around us.

Live by faith in what God has said about Christ and about what Christ has done for you. He is the root of your spirituality and He will also grow the fruit of it as well. Your spiritual life is rooted in the reception of the grace of God in Christ Jesus.

[Let us pray:] Lord Jesus Christ, in Your Resurrection You show Yourself to be victorious over all things, even death. Help me to live my Christian life by faith and not by sight. Help me to always stay connected to the way in which You bless us today, the Word and Sacraments that I may bear Your name in my daily life. Amen

I trust this enlightens your day and gives you strength. See you in church, soon!

The board meet March 11 with five members present. Barb Knuth lead opening prayer. Minutes were approved. Sunday School Report: Attendance for February Adults-15 Students-14. Missions: We have collected \$27.81 for March/April for Lutheran Braille Translators. A check in the amount of \$ 224.56 was sent to Whitley County Energy Assistance for January/ February. No report for Pastor or Library. Old Business: We discussed decorations, crafts, snacks, and registration for VBS.

Board of Youth:

Pastors Report:

1. We will receive the 2018 Indiana District LCMS Convention Assessment next month. (Unsure how much the per member assessment will be.)
2. The Lutheran Foundation has declined our latest grant request for a new sign. Any future ideas/ requests will require the following.
 - Registration to attend a Grant workshop.
 - Workshop attendance is required. Beginning in 2018, organizations are only now required to attend 1 workshop per year. Next meetings are April 11 at 5:30 pm- 7:00pm, or April 12 11:30am-1:00pm.
 - Concept Paper is submitted by the deadline date.
 - Missions Outreach Paper.
 - Download and complete the Mission Outreach Budget.
 - A committee reviews determines if the congregation should proceed with submitting the application.
 - TLF staff will send an email notifying the congregation of the Committees decision. If you are notified to proceed, and application link will be emailed.
 - Grant Applications including additional required documentation is submitted by deadline.
 - Grant Applications are reviewed and TLF Board of Directors makes the final decision on grant awards.
3. The LCMS Church Information Center has received inquiries regarding plans to active shooters in context of the church shooting in Texas. The LCMS Security Officer has provided the following online resources (links available in email Pastor received). U.S. Department of Homeland Security-Active Shooter Preparedness, also FBI-Active Shooter Resource. The Synod recommends congregations work with local law enforcement to put a plan together that works for you congregation. We have contacted Whitley County Sheriff's Department and are arranging a meeting with a few members to discuss security here at Zion. To provide full disclosure the following members at the meeting: Katie Rittner (certified active shooter trainer), Jeremy Grant, Jared Wikinson, Jim Mülle3tt, Michael Braun.

Old Business:

Katie Rittner submitted a request for funds for schooling. Also have we paid the remainder of the 2017 District pledge? We need to know whose names are on the Lehmberg Legacy if monies need to be moved.

New Business:

New Trustees will need to be found to replace Dan Knuth. We need a Security Team, we will follow up on new signage for the church. Discussion whether to remount the cross on the front of the church or replace it.

Jared made the directive to remove \$ 4,000 from the garage sale fund temporarily to pay \$3,000 to fulfill 2017 District pledge and \$ 1,000 to Katie for schooling. Changes will be made in the bulletin regarding budget.

With no other business Joyce Redit made a motion to adjourn Kenny Knuth 2nd the motion passed.


In June there will be a LWML Mitey Mite Walk Fundraiser at Valparaiso University. More details to come later.


OUR PURPOSE:


