Greetings in the Name of the Lord! And, Happy New Year! I'd first want to express my sincere disappointment we did not conduct our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service, nor our Christmas Day worship service. The weather simply didn't cooperate. Much had been planned to praise God in song and worship, as well as the work of our ladies in the Altar Guild preparing the Chancel in the bright white paraments of the season of Christmas; and as I write this note – Holy Communion remains ready upon the Altar for the tired, poor miserable sinners so in need of our Lord's body and blood. It was a long, sorrowful couple of days at this joyous time of year for your pastor... for the greatest joy I have discovered in my life has been to lead God's dear children in worship, sharing God's divine Word with them, and to administer His Holy Sacraments as He has called me to do here in this place... this place my wife and I call home. God be with each and every one of you as we begin this New Year in the company of our Lord here at Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church of Columbia City, Indiana.

I'd also like to make myself available to anyone in the congregation desiring a home visit from your pastor. (This has been and will continue to be of avail to everyone, anytime!) We can share scripture and Christ's Holy Meal together, privately. I and the Elders enjoy deeply our visitation time out with our shut-ins and hospitalized folks; and we'd be delighted to share time with anyone wishing us to do so!

Now. As had been requested by a couple of folks, I'm reprinting below what was my "sermon" from December 17th during our Congregation's Christmas Celebration. I had written this for our celebration back in 2016, but alas, the weather didn't cooperate then either. I hope you enjoy!

Text Matthew 1: 18 – 25

This 'tis the 3rd week of Advent, and within every pew, A child of God rests waiting, for gifts... old and of new. The church is prepared, adorned all pretty and bright, For that most holy of days, and of course Christmas night!

You see... a ruling was made, not sure as to just why... That all were to be registered – even pigs in a sty. So, off – out he went; with Mary his bride Joseph, to Bethlehem, right there by her side.

Caesar had ruled, 'you must now go at this time...' 'go home to your land and get into line!' The angel had said, not to fear nor to dread, That God would provide, for the Baby a bed.

The old and the young, all together they pray, Our Lord Jesus soon born, might sleep on the hay. Both Mary and Joseph, they traveled so far, Indeed it'd been better, if they'd just had a car!

Now Joseph was young, his life had no strife; He then asked the young Mary – if she'd be his wife. Upon wonder and wonder, how could he have known? That Mary was pregnant – for the Spirit had sown!

Joseph... himself – was frightened and scared To be unmarried... have a child he dared???? The angel did say 'of course he'd be fine! "Take her as wife! God is with you this time!"

So... Keeping Mary as spouse, Joseph took heed, To give birth to our Savior, the Spirit did plead. A very just man, and meaning no shame, He was convinced he would guard Him and give Him THE Name.

It all then took place, just as the prophet decreed, For God knew our world was oh so deeply in need. Sin had run rampant, as the people all fought; It was sure then to be, God's creation for naught.

The decree had been made, the registration on earth; But the Baby was ready, it was time for the birth! They searched and they sought, for a room they could stay... Mary feared and she fraught, for there could be no delay!

She gave birth to her firstborn, and wrapped Him all tight, It was a magical and marvelous... just wonderful feeling that night! The virgin had given' birth; as the angel had told, Now Joseph and cows, a beautiful baby behold!

A multitude of hosts, full of heavenly song, Praised God in His glory, for peace on the earth and righting the wrong. They all cheered and they prayed, and they sang out one verse... A Savior is born! Thus lifting the curse!

To some, near and far, this story is old; But how true that it's one that is repeatedly told. The grace God had shown on this glorious night, The shepherds beheld, with all glee and delight!

They too ran with haste, a Baby to behold(!); The truth of God's Word began to unfold. To others and all, the shepherds did say What they witnessed God do for all mankind that day.

Immanuel is born; means God with us! They said. The Shepherd of all God's children, asleep in that bed! Many wondered and worried, 'bout what was their part But Mary just smiled and treasured it all in her heart.

Now, I know it's still Advent, and continue it must! Let not our joy over gifts and trees be a bust. The true reason for the season is plain as its true, That Christ walked among us was nothing quite new.

God has loved us so much, I'm certain to read; Each time I feel low, or lonely in need... We'll hear all God's Word and share in His peace, His Son, our Lord, can only increase!

This sermon is lame, I'm sorry to say... But it's what God asked me to give you this day. To understand His peace is not really hard, And it seldom is found inside some Christmas card.

As we explore what God promised us long, long ago – We delight in this season (as often it would snow!) Whether young or whether old, remember this line: As wise men from far had hoped for their time.

God blessed us with a child, His only Son, our Lord That we'd all be together, all... in one accord. We'd share His peace; we'd spread the Word, Do not let this vision... 'er come blurred.

The joy that you feel, even after this quote – Is one that I hope will not end on this note! You see it is Christmas(!), a time full of joy About the real birth, of one baby boy.

In years long gone, when I... was much younger still, I'd pray for true peace, if... only God will. I have seen with my eyes, His glory before... It's which I share with this poem... for you all galore.

God be with you this day, as we worship and pray; I ask Him Lord Jesus...He'd continually stay. That we'd listen to Him and obey His commands And drop from our wants, our damning demands.

So get up on your feet! And repeat after me: Give glory to God! For all eternity! This Christmas I swear, I'll do as I'm told! For a child I am...however I'm old!

POINSETTIA PROGRAM – LADIES AID – DEC. 21, 2017

You can find a poinsettia's scarlet, star-shaped leaves everywhere you turn during the holidays. Poinsettias are one of the most popular Christmas decorations around, with more than \$200 million in sales every holiday season. In the United States, December 12 is National Poinsettia Day.

Many mistake the poinsettia's leaves as flower petals, but the flowers are actually the smaller, yellow buds in a poinsettia's center. These "bracts- the upper portion of the leaves – are famously red, although they actually bloom in a variety of hues, such as pink, white, and yellow. Poinsettias, also known as the "lobster flower" or "Mexican flame leaf", bloom in December, making them an ideal holiday flower.

The tropical shrubs, which have about 100 different species and reach heights of up to 12 ft. tall in their natural habitat. The Aztecs used to dye clothing and cure fevers with them. They were also used in Aztec religious ceremonies since they considered the color red a symbol of purity. They grow in warm tropical climates. In the "language" of flowers, red, white or pink poinsettias symbolize good cheer and success and are said to bring wishes of celebration.

The plant gained popularity in the 1820's largely thanks to Joel Roberts Poinsett, who was appointed the first U.S. ambassador to Mexico. He was an avid botanist and wandered the countryside in Mexico looking for new species of plants. He discovered a beautiful shrub by the side of the road. He took cuttings of the shrub and returned to his greenhouse in S. Carolina. This shrub turned out to be the poinsettia. Although Poinsett was an outstanding congressman and as an ambassador, he will always be remembered for bringing the poinsettia to the United States.

What does a poinsettia have to do with Christmas? One interpretation of the plant is as a symbol of the Star of Bethlehem, the heavenly body that led the three wise men to the place where Christ was born. The star shaped leaf symbolized the Star and the red color represents the blood sacrifice through the crucifixion of Jesus. It is also known as the flower of the holy night., and Christmas flower. It is also the December birth flower. This winter flower's association with Christmas comes from a Mexican legend. The legend is told that a child with no means has to take a gift to the Christmas eve church service. Being penniless, the child picked weeds from the side of the road. The congregation witnessed a miracle when the weeds turned into beautiful red and green flowers on the altar. These weeds, of course, turned out to be the poinsettia, our popular Christmas decoration.

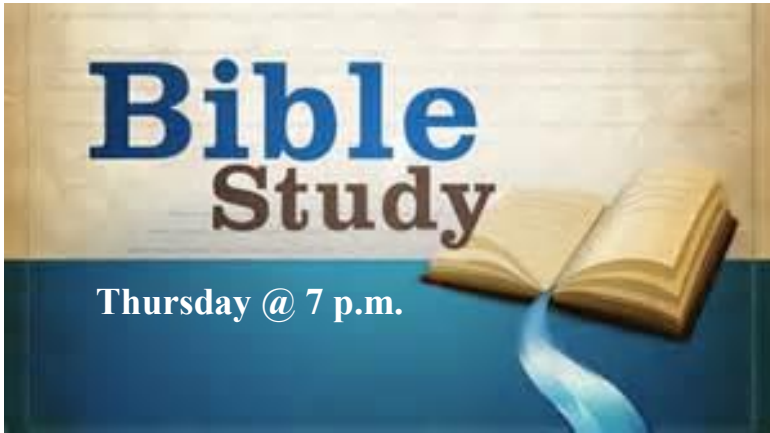
