The Question of Revitalization

“What will it take for the church to prosper in America again?”

This seems to be the fundamental question on people’s minds when they are discussing the Revitalization of the church-at-large. In their attempts to answer it they publish books, develop programs, and imagine movements. But books, programs, and movements aren’t the right answer for Revitalization. That shouldn’t surprise us. After all, the question that we tend to ask – “What will it take for the church to prosper in America again?” – isn’t even the right question.

One of the reasons that this is not the right question is that Revitalization is not an endeavor to restore the church to a status that it once held in American culture. While there was nothing intrinsically wrong with the church having an influential and honored place in our society, it is not especially important that the church enjoy such things.

The church can be the church she is called to be without being liked, appreciated, or favored by the culture in which she exists. Indeed, we may even find that we can more readily be a faithful church when we are not liked, appreciated, or favored.

And being a faithful church is – or, at least, should be – the goal of Revitalization.

The question that we should be asking ourselves about Revitalization isn't one that is framed around what the church looks like in the context of our culture, but one that explores how we might engage the people of our culture with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In other words, it's not "How do we make the church prosperous again?" but more like "How do we share the treasures of God's Word and Sacraments with the people in our community who are perishing?"

Once we've started asking the right question about Revitalization we are on our way to being a faithful church. Of course, asking the question isn't enough. Revitalization begins when we answer the question in word *and* action. When we do, we find that Revitalization doesn't depend upon the books, programs, and movements that are so prominent in the American church – and we may even discover that such things may hinder us from the simple way in which we are called to revitalize the church.

What is that simple way? This is a great Revitalization question because it goes beyond revitalizing the church to revitalizing us.

Not surprisingly, the simple way is not necessarily an easy way. It obliges us to stop looking to the pastor, or evangelism committee, or the congregation as a whole to share the Gospel with the people whom God has put into our lives and it depends upon each of us to speak God's Word of salvation to our neighbors, co-workers, classmates, family members, and friends.

Books, programs, and movements may be helpful resources to us as we seek new ways to bring the Gospel to new people, especially when we're reaching out to people who are not like us. But Revitalization does not happen through these things. Ultimately, Revitalization takes place as a work of the Holy Spirit through God's people when they faithfully respond to His call to be witnesses of Jesus to the people in their everyday lives.

What does it take to revitalize the church? Pastors faithfully proclaiming God's Word and rightly administering His Sacraments. Congregations committed to equipping and supporting members to be effective witnesses of Jesus. And you.

Questions to consider:

- *In what ways have I used "books, programs, or movements" to avoid answering the call to be a witness of Jesus to the people in my life?*
- *Who are the people in my life who are outside of the church and its influence but can be reached by me?*
- *What do I need to be a more effective witness of Jesus to the people in my life? Where will I find it?*

Church Council

December 16, 2014

Elders Report:

Steve Smith presented reports from November 11 and December 10 meetings. Pastor has applied for another Ministry Enhancement Grant for \$5000. Channel 15 (WANE tv) will be instituting a new procedure for reporting the cancellation of church services this winter as well as WOWO continuing their procedure. Indiana District Convention will be held in Fort Wayne June 25-26, 2015. Beta Sigma Psi of the National Lutheran Foundation has made available to graduating senior males a few scholarships/grants. If interested, contact Pastor Rittner. Zane Alexander Lepper, newborn son of Lindsey and Toby Lepper, will be baptized on Sunday, **January 11, 2015**.

Trustees Report:

Dan Knuth stated the new dehumidifier is in service in the basement. Heat has been

turned on for the winter and is monitored. Sacristy is nearly done! Peggy Brook said it is much better. Jerry Lahrman is on vacation so Dan Knuth is "keeping an eye on things". American Red Cross used Zion last week due to an emergency being held at the Methodist church; they said "thank you" for our pitching in. Discussed perhaps getting voting booths/voters here again as we've done in the past. Status on the shed: still on hold; not sure if paperwork is completely submitted, but will follow up. Lehmburg Legacy Fund paperwork is not complete to complete the transfer from "trust" to "legacy".

Board of Education:

Judy Gilbert read **November 2** and **December 7** minutes. Need to correct title of Barb Lahrman from "superintendent" to "chairperson"; motion made and seconded to do so. Barb Lahrman is ending her tenure in January. Pat Decker is doing treat bags for the children after the **December 14 Christmas** program. The Library is finished and a huge "thank you" to Larry Haugk for his help in finishing it. Missions project for Jan/Feb will be Whitley County Ministerial Assoc. Energy assistance program.

Board of Outreach:

Peg Brook said the Pastor Appreciation, board members thank you and greeting our new member, and the confirmands, was a huge success on November 10. After worship, Pastor Rittner was given a thank you gift for his work here at Zion by elder Ralph Brook and to be used on his and Katie's trip to Ireland. New member, April Brook, and

also the confirmands were welcomed. The game, STUMP THE PASTOR, was fun and questions were about members of our congregation. On November 3 the American Red Cross and Monica Koldyke presented a small program on how an AED works and cost of two (2) models; the AED would be used if someone's heart had stopped. Costs were \$1354 and \$1485 with a deadline of **December 31, 2014** for decision. Further discussion followed by council with Peggy Brook going to contact Monica with our questions. Instead of sponsoring a family this year, we're asking for hats, gloves and socks to be collected. The hats and gloves can be given to elementary schools while socks can be given to the nursing homes. Next meeting scheduled for **January 17, 2015**.

Pastor's Report: business as usual. Wanted to state that I was GOT playing the STUMP THE PASTOR game at the dinner; it was fun and I learned a few things. Want to thank Pastor Bryan Crane and Seminarian Peter Knudson for filling in while on vacation.

New Business:

Children's Christmas program a HUGE SUCCESS. Will be looking into a possible Lenten program. Jeff Braun suggested a possible idea for inviting the public to Lenten services. Ash Wednesday is **February 18, 2015** with Easter on **April 5, 2015**. There were many suggestions brought up by the council to get the community involved as part of our revitalization.

Our Guest Report:

Rev Robinson was pleased to notice the difference in the basement's smell as mentioned in #5 under Areas Needed Improvement from our consultation report given to all church members. He will begin his monthly meetings with Pastor Rittner in January and will attend the Voter's Meeting on Sunday, **January 18, 2015** to "re-affirm our going forward".

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn at 8:30pm with all reciting the Lord's Prayer.

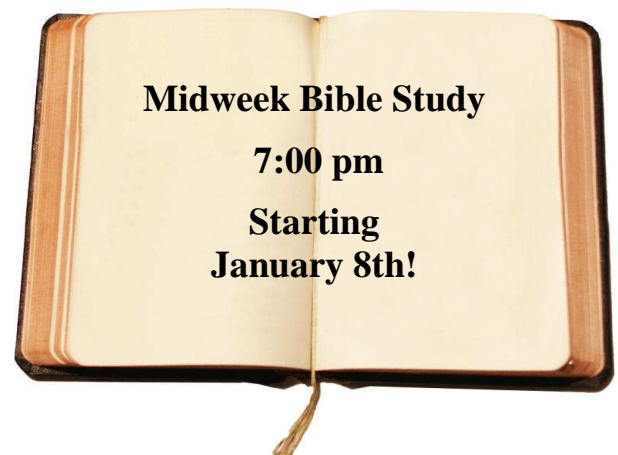
