Here in June, we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost. It's a day of wonder for some. It's the day the Holy Spirit was poured out on Christ's disciples, ten days after His Ascension into heaven. But looking at the account of that blessed day in Holy Scripture, Acts 2:1 – 21, there's some important aspects we ought to note ourselves. Like the very first verse, verse 1. It says: **“When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place.”** I'd like to emphasize the words **“they were all together in one place...”** It has been the custom of the Church and the calling of God that Jesus' disciples regularly gather **“in one place”**. It's called 'going to church.'

Here at Zion in Columbia City, we gather in the **“place”** located at 101 E. North Street, often referred to as 'right across from the Dairy Queen.' But we seldom **“all”** gather in this place. Oh, we often have 'many' of us here at church! I pray each day for all the souls entrusted to me by God as His under-shepherd here in this **“place”**. I pray that the Holy Spirit would lead many of our members into the Sanctuary for worship and to one of the many opportunities we have for Bible Study. But living and working and moving about the city for one or two years and not coming to church – well... that's not being a member of the church. And though we don't actually take “attendance”, we do notice when someone hasn't been here in a while. There are several that we haven't seen in some time. And, being human myself, one or two folks do seemingly 'slip through' and I have failed to notice their absence and follow up with them in a timely manner – and I beg your forgiveness when this happens!

St. Peter said:

“And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.” (Acts 2:17–21; ESV).

This portion of St. Peter's sermon at Pentecost fulfills that which the prophet Joel exclaimed years before. That

God's promises have come to fruition now with the coming of the Holy Spirit to disciples of Jesus. The last sentence quoted above, should be significant to us as we consider whether to come to church on Sunday (or Wednesdays!). For, to **"call upon the name of the Lord"** isn't something many of us do on a day-to-day basis. This 'invocation' **always** happens in the church! Every service we have – worship, baptism, wedding, funeral – every service begins by calling upon the name of the Lord! Yes; He is present in your home and in your work place and at the park and at your family gatherings and at your side every step you take. Jesus promised you that in Matthew 28:20: **"And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."** But I list below Scriptural accounts, that which God says to you and I **FOR** going to church for the right reasons:

Jesus Christ died for the church. Ephesians 5:25: Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her.

We must be imitators of Christ and His apostles. Luke 4:16: He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read. **Mark 1:21:** Jesus and his companions went to the town of Capernaum. When the Sabbath day came, he went into the synagogue and began to teach.

You learn and better understand Scripture. It increases your growth on your walk of faith. Colossians 3:16: Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. **2 Timothy 2:15:** Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.

To have fellowship with your Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. 1 John 1:3: We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. **Matthew 18:20:** For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them. **Matthew 28:20**" ... and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.

It is important to have fellowship with other believers. Share, encourage, teach, love, help, etc. Hebrews 10:24-25: And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. **Acts 2:42-47:** They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

To worship God. John 4:23-24: But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.

It is important for spiritual growth and spiritual strength. Colossians 1:9-10: And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God.

To put God first. Instead of doing other things on Sunday go to church. Matthew 6:33: But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

So, I hope you see that God wants you in church! God wants to hear you sing and praise Him! And He wants you to share with other like believing folks a fellowship and love – that you can carry out into all the world!

I pray to see you in church! Not just for some number of attendance. Not for anything other than that YOU may be fed, your soul nourished, and you can hear the Word of God assure you your sins are forgiven and that Jesus died and rose from the tomb so you could have everlasting life!


